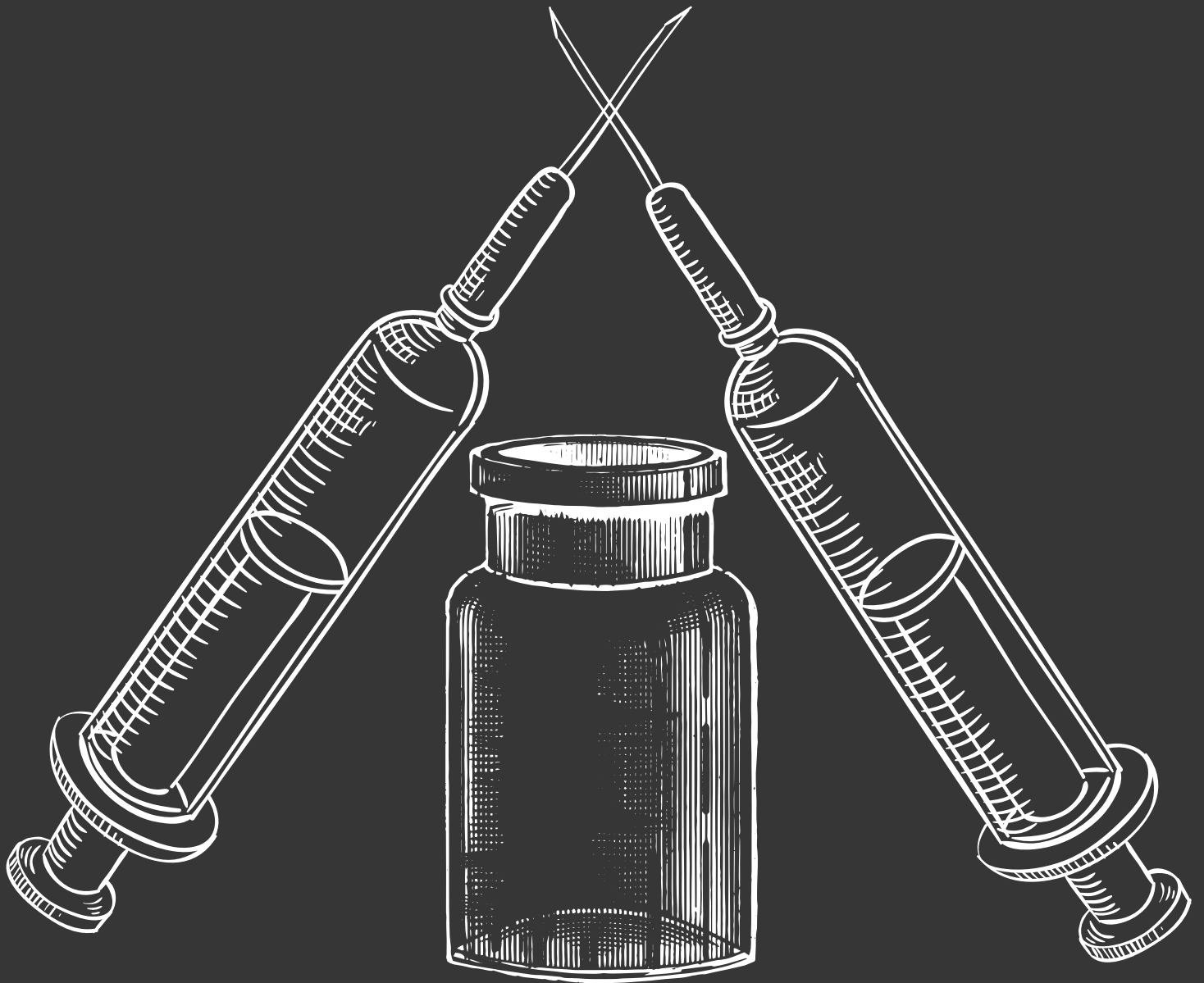

# ABOUT MAP



## MISSION

To recognize the resiliency of people who use drugs and to work in collaboration to create access points for overdose prevention and harm reduction services in Maine.

## VALUES

- We believe that all people have the right to access health care and meet their basic needs
- We believe that people are the expert of their own lives and have the right to choice and self-determination
- We believe that all people have the right to safety and respect
- We believe in ground-up, collective organizing
- We hold ourselves accountable to the communities we work within
- We recognize the impact of the war on drugs on all people, but especially communities of color
- We hold critical hope that all people can heal from the injustices and trauma they have experienced
- We commit to creating a world that rejects and deconstructs all forms of hate and oppression and we commit to reflecting on our own internalized oppression
- We believe people have the right to naloxone, safe consumption supplies, and safe consumption spaces
- We believe that people do not have to die from their drug use

# DISTRIBUTOR Q&A:

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## WHAT CAN A COMMUNITY DISTRIBUTOR DO?

- Train people in your community on overdose education
- Enroll participants and distribute naloxone
- Host community trainings
- Support organizing, policy reform, and mutual aid work in your community and statewide

## WHO CAN BE A MAP DISTRIBUTOR?

We want to talk with anyone who is interested in being part of our team; harm reductionists, people who use drugs, folx in recovery, community organizers, caregivers. All are welcome to reach out.

## HOW DO I BECOME A COMMUNITY DISTRIBUTOR?

Contact MAP to learn more and get signed up for the next community distributor training. MAP provides bi-monthly distributor trainings for new members of the team.

# DISTRIBUTOR Q&A:

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## DISTRIBUTOR MEETINGS

**Check-in meeting:** Join the MAP distributor network for a **drop-in style, monthly** meeting to connect with other community distributors, learn about what's happening across the state, and get updates from the MAP staff team!

**Organizing & Advocacy Meeting:** A **monthly** opportunity to create a collective response through organizing and advocacy work as part of the MAP team. Also a space to support other distributors in the work they are engaged in across the state.

*All meetings are optional and not required as part of the distributor role!*

## EXPECTATIONS & REPORTING

- Monthly check-in with the Director of Overdose Prevention programs
- Complete registration and refill process with participants and send in documentation monthly
- Maintain and update your naloxone inventory and send to MAP monthly
- Align your work within MAP's mission & values

## LEVELS OF COMMITMENT

**Certified Distributor and MAP Volunteer:** This is a trained and certified distributor for MAP. This role agrees to the expectations and reporting.

**Informal Distribution:** Do you want to get naloxone into your community, but can't commit to the formal distributor role? We'll work with you to figure out what could work!
